This seminar looks at the impact of competition law on IP practice, focusing on the issues and problems that arise for IP practitioners. Considering agreements restricting competition, and abuse of dominant position in litigation, licences and agreements, it will consider what is regarded as anti-competitive by the UK's Competition Commission and by the EU Commission and the approaches they take to anti-competitive practices. It will include a detailed look at how this affects patents practice, particularly in the electronics and pharmaceutical sectors, and it will also touch on the US approach to these issues. It will include a review of relevant UK and European statute and case law.
